Consistent with the guiding principles of Responsible Care® we, as employees of Roche Colorado Corporation acknowledge our responsibilities to each other, to our families, to our neighbors, and to the community in which we operate. In order to help fulfill these responsibilities, we are committed to maintaining a safe and healthful working environment; incorporate continuous improvement of safety into the fundamental business activities we undertake; and comply with all applicable laws, regulations, and other requirements to which Roche Colorado subscribes.

We believe that safety must be an integral part of every task and must be given the same attention, effort, and importance that is given to product quality, environmental stewardship, employee morale, cost control, and production. No job is so urgent, no work is so important that we cannot devote adequate resources and time to do it safely. Any other action is unacceptable.


We believe that all injuries and illnesses can be prevented and that all employees are responsible for assuring safety. Regular, ongoing evaluation programs will be conducted to assess our compliance with company directives, regulatory requirements, and progress toward achieving safety-related goals.

Individual employees are responsible for following all established safety policies and procedures. Employees are not expected to work under conditions that they feel to be unsafe, but rather are expected to bring such conditions to the attention of their Managers for resolution. Employees are also responsible for taking an active role in ensuring their own safety both on and off the job.

Directors and Managers are responsible for encouraging employees to promptly report unsafe conditions, for taking appropriate corrective actions in response to such conditions, and for continually fostering among employees an attitude of safety consciousness.

The Operating Committee is responsible for creating an environment and allocating resources so that processes are developed and engineered, employees are trained, and facilities are designed, constructed, and maintained in ways that provide safe and healthful conditions for employees, contractors, and the community.

The Compliance Team is specifically charged with providing proactive leadership and support to all Roche Colorado employees in their safety efforts. They are responsible for providing technical guidance and consultation on safety matters, for establishing, maintaining, and reviewing systems to assist in providing safe work areas, and for championing employees' efforts to identify and resolve safety-related problems.





6. Keep all employees and the community informed about the potential environmental risks of our operations and the progress of our programs for minimizing those risks.




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
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
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
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ROCHE COLORADO CORPORATION POLICY ON QUALITY

We hereby commit to:


1. Comply with all applicable Corporate and Regulatory requirements and procedures related to the manufacture of pharmaceutical products;

7. Actively solicit input from our Customers to understand and meet their expectations regarding the Quality of our products.




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
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
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
